Tasks

- Weeding and brush clearing

- Making trail improvements (remove debris, roots, etc).
- Tree trimming
- Composting
- Cleaning owl and bird boxes
- Mowing grass and blowing debris from decks
- Maintaining pollinator garden
- Tending to irrigation system
- Special projects (deck repair, irrigation system, etc.)

Skills

- Ability to perform physical labor related to gardening and lawn maintenance tasks
- May require some lifting - if necessary
- Ability to operate power tools (lawn mowers, hedge trimmers, etc.) - if necessary
- Skilled laborers (carpenters, electricians, etc.) are always a big plus for special projects

Setting

The workdays occur at the Audubon Newhall Preserve.

The Audubon Newhall Preserve is a 50 acre nature preserve located at 55 Palmetto Bay Road on the south end of Hilton Head Island that is owned and operated by the Hilton Head Island Audubon Society.
